Mayor Byers shares City's



#### response to COVID-19

"The city is taking all necessary steps to continue to provide vital public services," Yakima Mayor Patricia Byers said in a video message she shared last month in response to COVID-19.

She also calls on Yakima residents to take precautions and do their part in following the guidance of health officials, such as social distancing.

"We are a community of character, compassion and faith," Mayor Byers said. "Let us continue in that vein."

The City's response to COVID-19 includes:

- The City has created a dedicated webpage at www.yakimawa.gov/covid19 with updates and links to county, state, national and world health agencies.
- All City facilities are closed until further notice. The City

#### **COVID-19 precautions:**

- Wash hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash and wash your hands.
- Clean and disinfect objects and surfaces.
- Stay at home and away from others if you are sick.



In addition to maintaining social distancing of at least six feet, the Yakima Health District offers the above recommendations to stay in compliance with guidelines and restrictions now in place due to COVID-19.

During this time of COVID-19 the Yakima community is supporting first responders such as Yakima firefighters.



The videos share how to create and submit a police report online at Yakimapolice.org.




Yakima police officers continue to respond to in-progress calls, but encourage the public to use the online and telephone reporting systems as much as possible for non-priority calls.

YPD reminds the public to stay home and stay healthy.





### City of Yakima offers tree inventory map


