**Subject: Grind and Overlay Project Update** 

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## **Citywide Road Resurfacing Project Update**

An ongoing citywide street repaving project that began in May will affect traffic in several areas of Yakima from October 6<sup>th</sup> through October 9<sup>th</sup>. The project involves reconditioning more than 90 lane miles of roads and will cost a total of \$15 million.

From Monday, October 6<sup>th</sup> through Thursday, October 9<sup>th</sup>, periodic lane closures will occur each day from 6:00 am to 4:00 pm on Washington Avenue between 15<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 1<sup>st</sup> Street and on 6<sup>th</sup> Street between Pacific Avenue and H Street.

On Tuesday, October 7<sup>th</sup>, the center lanes of 40<sup>th</sup> Avenue within 300 feet both north and south of the intersection of 40<sup>th</sup> Avenue and River Road will be closed from 7:00 pm to 6:00 am.

Various sections of the following streets will be also be completely closed to traffic overnight from 7:00 pm to 6:00 am on different days during the week of October 6<sup>th</sup> through October 9<sup>th</sup>:

- Nob Hill Boulevard between 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue and just west of the Nob Hill overpass
- Mead Avenue between 11th Avenue and Fair Avenue
- MLK, Jr. Boulevard between 1st Street and 8th Street
- Lincoln Avenue between 1st Street and 10th Street
- Lincoln Avenue in the vicinity of Lewis Avenue and Clarke Avenue

Detour routes will be in place so drivers can go around the closed portions of those streets.

While the grind and overlay work is underway, traffic delays in the project areas will occur. Drivers should use alternate routes if possible until the work is completed.

Access to homes and businesses in the project areas will be maintained as best as possible and emergency vehicles will be allowed through the project areas if necessary.

As always, the schedule for these types of projects is subject to change daily dependent on weather, equipment failure, and emergencies.
