Parade, tree lighting on December 3 kick-off the holiday season in Yakima

The Holiday Lighted Parade and treelighting ceremony Sunday, Dec. 3rd, at Millennium Plaza will kick-off holiday festivities in Yakima.

The parade begins at 6 pm at 6th Ave and continues on Yakima Ave to 3rd St, ending in front of the Capitol Theatre.

No on-street parking will be allowed along the parade route from 4 pm (4:15 pm on S. 3rd St.) on Sunday until the completion of the parade. The parade route will also be closed to motorized traffic.

Immediately after the parade, a lighting ceremony will be held for the community tree at Millennium Plaza.

Transit shuttles canceled for Luminaria

Luminaria at Yakima Area Arboretum is Dec. 8th and 9th. The grounds will be lit by over a thousand candles and twinkling lights. Children's crafts and shopping in the Arboretum's gift shop will also be available.

However, Yakima Transit will not provide shuttles to Luminaria this year due to a driver shortage. As a result, the Arboretum has an online, timed-entry reservation system for parking during Luminaria.

There will be no garbage collection service on either day. The City's Refuse Division garbage pickup service will be on a one-day delay both weeks.

There will be no Yakima Transit bus service on Christmas and New Year's Day.

City welcomes new finance director

Yakima City Manager Bob Harrison has announced that Mark Roberts has been appointed as the City's finance and budget director.

Roberts replaces Jennifer Ferrer-Santa Ines, who resigned earlier this year to become the finance director for the City of Marysville. Ferrer-Santa Ines was hired by the City of Yakima in 2021.

Roberts began his tenure with the City of Yakima on Nov. 8th. He most recently served as director of finance for the City of Salinas, California.

Before being hired by the City of Salinas in 2021, he had worked as the finance director for the City of National City, California since 2012.



As Yakima's finance and budget director, Roberts oversees a staff of about 30 employees in the Financial Services, Purchasing, and Utility Services divisions.

The total budget for the City's Finance and Budget Department in 2023 is about \$5.6 million.






Did you know?

Make sure your tree is at least 3 feet away from heat sources like fireplaces, radiators and space heaters.






City Council action summary - Nov. 2023
