Clean City Program reports progress during Q1 2022

Abating/cleaning 1,336 graffiti incidents, clearing over 35 tons of garbage and removing 563 grocery carts are some of the City's Clean City Program activities during the first 3 months of 2022.

The City of Yakima's "Clean City" program is under the direction of the City's Public Works Department. Program objectives are:

- Address visual blight (trash, graffiti, dangerous building, abandoned vehicles, etc.)
- Address unscheduled collection of waste and litter from the City's public areas/thoroughfares
- Expedite clean-up of illegal dumps
- Clean up homeless encampments
- Support Yakima Police officers in unlawful camping enforcement
- Coordinate with neighborhoods for annual clean-up events
- Create educational components
- Engage with partners and volunteers

City of Yakima offices to close for Juneteenth holiday

City of Yakima offices and nonemergency services will close Monday, June 20, in observance of the Juneteenth holiday.

Closures include City Hall, the Public Works office, the Y-PAC office and the Harman Center.

Yakima Transit will not provide bus service on June 20. Garbage pick-up will not be delayed, but the Refuse Division office will be closed June 20th.

Juneteenth commemorates the emancipation of enslaved African-Americans. Originating in Galveston, Texas, it has been celebrated annually on June 19 in various parts of the United States since 1865.

Juneteenth is a federal holiday. In October 2021, the Yakima City Council amended City of Yakima Municipal Code Section 2.40.080, Holidays with Pay, to add Juneteenth as a paid holiday for city employees.

City Council action summary - May 2022

Yakima City Council action during its meetings in May included:

- Approving agreement with Millennium Foundation to install mosaic at Miller Park;
- Authorizing grant agreement acceptance from the Department of Commerce through the Community Law Enforcement Partnership Program to implement the "Community Action Days" program;
- Agreeing to continue holding hybrid City Council meetings live in person and via Zoom;
- Directing staff to apply for Yakima County ARPA funds for internet in City parks
- Approving the Yakima Planning Commission's recommendations regarding
