Budget review meetings begin May 9th

Seven sessions planned at four sites

Over the next three months, the Yakima City Council will hold a series of budget review meetings at four different locations around the city.

The Council is holding the meetings at different locations to make them as accessible to the public as possible. Listed at right are meeting dates and location

"During its retreat last month, the City Council asked department heads to determine which lines of service could be reduced based on a 10 percent reduction of each department's budget," said Communications & Public Affairs Director Randy Beehler. "Department heads will present Council with their suggestions for 10 percent across-the-board reductions."

The City Council is not expected to make any decisions regarding reductions during the budget review meetings, Beehler added. That process won't occur until budget discussions in the fall of this year.

City of Yakima launches airport destination poll

Yakima Air Terminal-McAllister Field (YKM) wants to hear from the public about preferred airline destinations through a new poll at Yakima Airport Destinations Survey (zencity.io)

It asks the public to select which of the following destinations from YKM would be their top priority.

- Seattle (SEA)
- Las Vegas (LAS)
- Phoenix (PHX)
- Salt Lake City (SLT)
- Los Angeles (LAX)

The poll also offers an option for respondents to write in other destinations not listed above.

It is available through May 31.



"We appreciate the community's support for YKM and look forward to continued feedback through this poll to help prioritize which airline destinations to pursue," said Yakima Airport Director Rob Hodgman.

This is the second poll the City of Yakima has published this year about YKM.

A poll in January received 1,404 responses, with 83 percent strongly supporting expansion of YKM.

As with the new airline destination poll, the previous poll allowed respondents to reply anonymously.

Washington state plans to build a new regional airport in the next decade.

On January 3rd, 2023, the Yakima City Council approved a letter to the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) asking for YKM to be considered as the new preferred airport location.

Telecommunicators treat every 911 call as an emergency until they have determined otherwise. When a 911 call is answered, the main goal is to find the location so help can be sent. If you call 911, the best thing to do is to stay on the line.




SunComm was inundated with accidental 9-1-1 calls during the last week of April. If you accidentally dial 9-1-1 please stay on the line. SunComm's tips to prevent a misdial of 9-1-1 include locking your phone if you put it in your purse or pocket and keeping phones away from children as even non-active phones call 9-1-1. Also, if you use 9 to dial out from a business phone, pause between 9 and the intended phone number.
