Yakima Valley Events Will Be Part of 33rd Annual National Night Out

Throughout the Yakima Valley and across the nation, communities will be throwing a going away party for crime during the 33rd annual National Night Out on Tuesday, August 2nd. In addition to numerous neighborhood block parties, several organizations and businesses will be sponsoring National Night Out events.

The Yakima Police Department and U.S. Cellular are cosponsoring a family-friendly event on August 2nd from 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm at Sarg Hubbard Park. The citywide party will include kid's activities, free food and drinks, emergency vehicle demonstrations, and much more.

National Night Out was started in 1984 and is the brainchild of Matt Peskin, who was the executive director of the National Association of Town Watch (NATW) at the time. The NATW is a nonprofit organization dedicated to the development and growth of crime and drug prevention programs nationwide. NATW's membership now includes now more than 6,500 crime, drug, and violence prevention organizations.

In its first year, about 400 communities participated in National Night Out activities. The 33rd annual version of the event this year is expected to include more than 16,000 cities and towns and an estimated 38 million people.

While the traditional lights on and front porch vigils remain a part of National Night Out, the variety of events that take place in communities has expanded considerably over the years to include block parties, cookouts, parades, visits from police, festivals, neighborhood walks, safety fairs, contests, rallies and meetings.
