

Downtown parade to honor veterans

Veterans Day Parade is 10:45 am to 12:30 pm on Tuesday, Nov. 11

The Yakima community will honor its veterans and all U.S. military veterans by staging the 2025 Veterans Day Parade in Downtown Yakima on Tuesday, November 11th.

The parade is sponsored by the Veterans of Foreign Wars - Post 379.

The parade will begin at 10:45 am at the intersection of Yakima Avenue and 6th Street. The route will continue west on Yakima Avenue to 6th Avenue.

It is scheduled to end at 12:30 pm.

City closures planned for Veterans Day

Many City of Yakima's facilities will be closed Tuesday, Nov. 11, in observance of Veterans Day. That includes City Hall, Y-PAC, and Parks and Recreation offices.

Business offices for the Police and Fire Departments will be closed. Emergency services will remain available.

The Harman Center will be closed November 11th. Yakima Transit fixed-route buses, Dial-A-Ride and Yakima-Ellensburg Commuter will not run on Nov. 11th.

The Refuse Division will provide regular garbage collection services on Nov. 11.

Organizers anticipate approximately 750 participants and at least 50 vehicles in the parade.

No parking will be allowed on Yakima Avenue between 6th Street and 6th Avenue from 8:45 am on November 11th until the parade is completed.

Cars parked along that portion of Yakima Avenue during that time will be subject to being towed at the owner's expense.

Yakima Avenue will be closed to motorized traffic from 6th Avenue to 6th Street.

Overnight Closure Nob Hill and Fair Ave intersection

- E. Nob Hill Blvd and Fair Ave closed, 7 pm to 6 am, Monday - Thursday, through mid-December.
- Detours posted. Access maintained to properties.
- Overnight closure needed for upgrades: new traffic signal, reconstructing/widening intersection and water/stormwater improvements
- Work will resume in March, weather dependent. Project scheduled to be completed June 2026.

Closures planned for Thanksgiving

Many City of Yakima facilities will be closed Thursday and Friday, Nov. 27th and 28th for the Thanksgiving holiday. That includes City Hall, Y-PAC, and Parks and Recreation offices.

Municipal Court and business offices for Police and Fire will close. Emergency services will remain available.

The City's Harman Center will be closed Nov. 27-29. Lions Pool will be closed on Thanksgiving, but will be open on Friday.

Yakima Transit will not provide bus service on Thanksgiving Day, but will operate its normal Friday schedule on Nov. 28th.

There will be no City of Yakima garbage pick-up service on Thursday, Nov. 27th. Garbage scheduled for pick-up on Thursday will instead be collected Friday, Nov. 28th. Garbage pick-up scheduled for Friday will be collected Saturday, Nov. 29th.


