Downtown Yakima art installment continues through March 15, 2019 New Windows Alive! Exhibit on Display

Empty storefronts in Downtown Yakima are taking on a new life with the latest "Windows Alive!" installment.

Works by six Yakima Valley artists were unveiled October 5th during a First Friday event. The artwork is displayed in storefront windows along the north side of Yakima Avenue between 3rd Street and 4th Street.

Meet the Artists

- Maria Navarro, a watercolor artist based in Yakima. Her subject matter focuses on faces, birds and nature.
- LeAnne Ries of Yakima works in mixed media and acrylic. Most of her paintings

Following an evaluation of submitted art work, artists from the region were chosen to be part of the latest "Windows Alive!" exhibit, which continues through March 15th, 2019.

"It's always exciting to see the new artwork," said Yakima Arts Commission Chair Noel Moxley. "Windows Alive! is a wonderful program that adds to the vibrancy of Downtown Yakima."

Each artist received a \$250 stipend.

The Yakima Arts Commission developed the Windows Alive! idea to harness the creativity of Central Washington artists.

The commission is an advisory group appointed by the Yakima City Council.

- Gail Molina of Yakima. Molina's work uses candy and gum wrappers to create art, including art pieces inspired by nature and the workings of the brain.
- **Guy Brooke** of Naches. Brooke's work focuses on custom-carved doors depicting scenery and geometric designs. He primarily works with knotty alder wood.
- Bessie Wilson of the Yakama Nation.
 Wilson uses a type of weaving known as twining. Her work features seasonal colors.
- **Meghan Flynn** of Yakima. Her paintings and drawings explore concepts and displays of human emotion.



Public Works landscaping to save water

Work is wrapping up on a second City of Yakima landscaping project that will conserve water. The current project involves installing irrigation lines and plants that require little water in landscaping areas around the City of Yakima's Public Works Division at 2301 Fruitvale Blvd.

"There is a two-fold purpose: One is to conserve water and the other is to install a demonstration garden to show residents an alternative to grass and high-water-use plants," said Assistant Public Works Director David Brown. "We are showing that low-water-use gardens can be beautiful. We have focused on planting native, low-water-use species that are aesthetically pleasing."

Costs for the new water-conservation effort are being covered from a \$63,500 Sustain and Manage America's Resources for Tomorrow (SMART) grant through the Bureau of Reclamation, sponsored through the Yakima Basin Integrated Plan.

Earlier this spring the City installed new grant-funded landscaping in Downtown Yakima on the east side of 2nd Street from Yakima Avenue to Staff Sgt. Pendleton Way. That project, too, involved new landscaping that required little water. It will reduce water consumption by about a third, Brown said.

City of Yakima names new Finance Director



Yakima City Manager Cliff Moore has announced that Steve Groom has been chosen as the City's new Finance and Budget Director.

"The City is fortunate to have Steve Groom joining its senior management team," said Moore. "Steve has a broad range of finance experience in both the public and private sectors. He has helped the organizations he's worked for modernize and enhance their finance and budget operations."

He previously served as finance director for the City of Palestine, Texas until August of this year.

Before that, Groom had been the chief financial officer for the City of Keller, Texas and the Beach Cities Health District (Redondo Beach, Calif.).

Groom worked for the non-profit Phoenix Houses of California, a substance abuse treatment organization, from 2000 to 2004, and Burbank, California-based UniHealth Ventures Pharmacy from 1992 to 2000.

"A city budget is not about money, it's about delivering quality services to the community, albeit with limited resources," said Groom.

He and his wife, Kathleen, have a total of four children, all of whom are grown.

As Director of Finance and Budget, Groom will oversee a staff of about 35 employees in the Financial Services, Purchasing, and Utility Services divisions. The total budget for the City's Finance and Budget Department in 2018 is about \$4,000,000.

The City of Yakima-owned plant processes wastewater from homes, businesses, and industrial facilities in Yakima, Union Gap, Terrace Heights, and Moxee.


