What are the City of Yakima's budget goals?



The City of Yakima operates on a 2-year (biennial) budget.

The Yakima City Council approved the 2023-24 biennial budget in late 2022.

City Council is now working on adjustments to the 2024 budget.



#### 2023 - 2024 Budget goals remain the same:

- 1. Achieve a balanced budget in every fund.
- 2. Assure prioritized services citywide.
- 3. Preserve General Fund's reserve, with a goal of 25% of expenditures.
- 4. Establish sustainable funding for equipment replacement.
- 5. Creation of a 5-year capital budget, developed for all funds, including projects within the General Fund.

What are City Council's budget priorities?



The current budget process started in 2022. It began with strategic planning.

### <u>Yakima City Council strategic priorities</u> for the 2023-24 budget biennium are:

- 1. Public Safety
- 2. Fiscal Sustainability
- 3. Housing
- 4. Strengthening Partnerships 5. Investment in Infrastructure



How does the City of Yakima spend your money?



The City of Yakima budgets for most services using what is called the "General Fund." It pays for things you usually think about when it comes to the budget, such as:
