

**NOTICE OF FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

These notices shall satisfy two separate but related procedural requirements for activities to be undertaken by the Yakima Housing Authority.

REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS

On or about May 19, 2026 the City of Yakima Planning Division will authorize the Yakima Housing Authority to submit a request to HUD for the release of name of grant program funds under Section 8 Project Based Vouchers, to undertake a project known as Lewis, Spruce and Sixth Development – 415 N. 6th Ave for the purpose of constructing three (3) one-bedroom units in a triplex style building to help address the housing needs identified through the Yakima Housing Authority waitlist.

FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

The City of Yakima Planning Division has determined that the project will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required. Additional project information is contained in the Environmental Review Record (ERR) on file at Yakima City Hall 129 N. 2nd Street, Yakima, WA 98901 and may be examined or copied weekdays 8:30 A.M to 4:30 P.M.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Any individual, group, or agency may submit written comments on the ERR to the City of Yakima Planning Division. All comments received by May 18, 2026 will be considered by the City of Yakima Planning Division prior to authorizing submission of a request for release of funds. Comments should specify which Notice they are addressing.

ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION

The City of Yakima Planning Division certifies to HUD that Victoria Baker in her capacity as City Manager consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is

brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the Yakima Housing Authority to use Program funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

HUD will accept objections to its release of fund and the City of Yakima Planning Division's certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the City of Yakima Planning Division; (b) the City of Yakima Planning Division has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to HUD at 909 1st Ave, Seattle, WA 98104. Potential objectors should contact HUD to verify the actual last day of the objection period.

This site was selected to answer the housing needs based on Yakima Housing Authority's waitlist. The proposed sixth avenue was already within the YHA's portfolio, sat vacant awaiting an opportunity. 415 N 6th was accepted by YHA as a donation from the City of Yakima. The site contained a dilapidated house that continued to be graffitied and trespassed. Due to its location, adjacent to YHA's existing housing, the City asked YHA to accept the property. YHA agreed and has had the Sixth Ave property in the portfolio since 2018, the original house was immediately removed, and the site has sat vacant waiting for an efficient time to develop.

Description of the Proposed Project [24 CFR 50.12 & 58.32; 40 CFR 1508.25]:

Lewis, Spruce and Sixth (LSS) is a scattered site development located at 316 N. Lewis, 914 E. Spruce and 415 N. Sixth. This development will infill three undeveloped sites in the City of Yakima and will help to address housing needs identified through the Yakima Housing Authority (YHA) waitlist. The waitlist identifies the need for additional studio, one-, and two-bedroom units for general low-income families, seniors and homeless at entry individuals. Each of the sites is adjacent to housing currently owned and operated by YHA to ensure efficiency. The locations are within a half mile of many services and many more within a half hour bus ride. Each site has a bus stop within a half mile. The proposed 415 N Sixth Avenue site will be comprised of new construction three (3), one (1) - bedroom units in a triplex style building. The site will blend seamlessly with the existing development and will include alley access to parking stalls.
